Part One: What is Pathway of Hope?

- 1. How does "From Serving to Solving" resonate with you?
- 2. Discuss the four stages to sufficiency: Crisis, Vulnerability, Increasing Stability, and Sufficiency. Do you agree with the logic of the theory and why?
- 3. How can a corps congregation help foster Hope in a client?
- 4. The goal of breaking the cycle of intergenerational poverty has many facets: How might your corps support and equip families (both parents and children) to reach this goal?

Part Two: Getting your corps involved

- 1. Review the goals of providing spiritual care through a pastoral care plan/committee and discuss some ways your corps could implement these goals:
 - a. Developing relationship of trust
 - b. Providing opportunities to worship
 - c. Connecting families to corps programming that meets their needs
 - d. Assisting with the ongoing needs of Pathway of Hope program
- 2. Would a Family Life group be a possibility in your corps? What expertise could you share?
- 3. What other opportunities might your corps be equipped to offer?

Part Three: Planning for Women's Ministries Success

Please follow the next three steps:

<u>Awareness</u>: is the first step – After watching the presentation: invite the caseworker to educate women on the Pathway of Hope Program in your corps and the needs of the program and families involved

<u>Strategize</u>: With the caseworker, women's ministries can strategize as to how they as a group can minister to the women in the program

- (1) What can they offer that would assist women with families in taking action to improve their stability? Does this involve special programming or volunteering in addition to regular programming?
 - (2) What resources can they supply to the Pathway of Hope local program?
 - (3) How can they encourage relationships with the women and their families?
 - (4) Make plans and goals and meet regularly to evaluate and update strategy

<u>Publicize</u>: Publicize the programs they can offer to the participants as part of the Pathway of Hope Orientation; If applicable, encourage the activities for inclusion in goals. Be sure to invite personally and then welcome as a friend when people do attend.
