## SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS FOR CHILDREN OF OFFICERSAND AUXILIARY CAPTAINS (Effective July 1. 2022)

The Territorial Commander, upon the recommendation of the Territorial Finance Council and in accordance with national uniformity, has approved the following:

## A. PURPOSE

The scholarship grant applies to the children of active and retired officers. Children of officers serving in non-USA appointments will be allowed this consideration covering periods when the child attends school either in the United States or in an approved American school abroad. Funding will be determined by the home territory. The purpose of this plan is to render financial assistance to officers' children who desire to pursue higher or specialized education as defined below, and/or who desire to enter the College/School for Officer Training.

#### 1. Higher Education

Studies above the high school level for which credits are given toward a college degree (whether or not the individual contemplates completion of the total college curriculum), and for which credits are transferable to accredited schools of higher learning; Bible college whose credits may or may not be transferred to other schools of higher learning; postgraduate courses.

# 2. Specialized Education

Specialized studies offered (1) by a technical, vocational, or business school or college, or by a Bible or law school, in a program which (a) qualifies for credit towards a bachelor's (or higher) degree; or (b) trains individuals for employment in recognized occupations, including nurses' training (which may also be pursued in connection with studies toward a degree), secretarial courses, social work courses, and courses that are of post high school level which are designed to help physically and/or mentally challenged children train for a vocation, and (2) by an educational organization (a) which is authorized under Federal or state law to offer such program, and (b) which is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency.

## 3. College/School for Officer Training

#### **B. CONDITIONS**

To qualify for the grant, the following conditions must be met:

- 1. Child must have reached his/her eighteenth (18th) birthday or have graduated from high school.
- 2. It is understood that scholarship grants will only be excluded for purposes of Federal income, SECA and FICA taxes to the extent that they are applied towards "qualified" expenses: that is, tuition, fees, books, supplies, and equipment, which expenses do <u>not</u> include room and board.
- 3. Child must be a full-time student participating in a post high school education as described above.

- 4. Scholarship will not be granted for correspondence courses, part-time or evening school classes, except when student attending evening classes is a full-time student.5. Application for scholarship grant MUST be made BEFORE or WITHIN the school year, otherwise the amount for that year is <u>forfeited</u>.
- 6. To qualify for the grant in the first year, the officer's child must have a "C" average, or better, from a secondary school.
- 7. Under extenuating circumstances, an officer's child who does not have a "C" average in a secondary school, can be accepted on a one-year probationary period. At the end of that period, the student must have achieved a "C" average, or better, or must forfeit further scholarships.
- 8. Where a student has not graduated from a secondary school but has passed a high school equivalency test, that student may be accepted on a one-year probationary period. At the end of that period, the student must have achieved a "C" average, or better, or must forfeit future scholarships.
- 9. Continued eligibility for grants will be determined as applications are received, on the basis of the student's maintaining a "C" average, or better, and otherwise meeting conditions for receipt of grants set forth in this minute.

#### C. PAYMENT

- 1. The scholarship grant, except as provided below, shall not exceed \$9,277 per academic year for four years.
- 2. In the case of nurses training programs or an accelerated college course in which students go to school 12 months of the year and complete the course in three years, the maximum grant of \$37,108 may be paid over a period of three years rather than four, but not in excess of \$12,369 per year.
- 3. An officer's child who enters the College/School for Officer Training is eligible to receive scholarships up to \$9,277 per year during the period the child is in residence at the College/School for Officer Training. The total amount of the grant, including amounts paid prior to entering the College/School for Officer Training, shall not exceed \$37,108.
- 4. The <u>maximum</u> annual allowance will be \$9,277 for the appropriate forty-week year. Academic years may commence in fall or winter/spring semesters. The total grant will not exceed eight (8) semesters. Student nurses and students in an accelerated program (see section C, 2) may draw \$12,369 per year (payable semi-annually) for a three-year course of training.
- 5. If the education of an officer's child is interrupted by military service and he/she continues after <u>completing</u> a tour of duty, the maximum allowance may be drawn over a period of four years.
- 6. If an <u>education</u> cannot be immediately commenced or is interrupted for reasons such as health or economy, grants may still be paid, but not exceeding \$37,108. Eligibility will cease at age 29, with the exception of interruption for military service.
- 7. The age <u>limitation</u> will be waived for cadets entering the College/School for Officer Training.

Note: If the grant is approved, it will be made payable to the student or a qualified matching grant educational institution and be excludable for purposes of Federal income, SECA and FICA taxes according to the terms stated in Section B.2.

#### D. PROCEDURE

- 1. Application for a grant must be made by letter or e-mail. Forms will then be provided for <u>submission</u>, with such additional information as may be necessary as directed by the appropriate headquarters. The application is to be finalized at the Education Department or equivalent at national/territorial headquarters for approval by National Business Council/Territorial Finance Council.
- 2. <u>Applications</u> for scholarship grants for children of officers in field and divisional appointments are to carry the divisional finance board's/council's approval if the grant is funded at field or command level.
- 3. No payment may be drawn until the approved application, has been received by the applicant.
- 4. Payment should be charged to the appropriate account as specified in the accounting guide.
